COMMUNITY NOTICE ~ JUNE 8, 2021

The Province of Manitoba is still at a Critical Red level. The existing Public Health Orders are still in effect and will be revisited on June 12, 2021 by the Chief Provincial Public Health Officer, Dr. Brent Roussin. These Public Health Orders are still being followed in the Community of Cross Lake.

The Chief and Council, Mayor and Council in collaboration with the Cross Lake Pandemic Planning Committee has agreed to lift the following **Community Restrictions** effective immediately based on the outcome of our Cross Lake Vaccination Clinics. We have done good but could do better.

The lifting of the following Community Restrictions are as follows:

- The Shopping Districts Schedule will be discontinued, Northmart and Family Foods will have to follow and implement the Provincial Health Orders in place.
 - Only one person per household will be allowed to enter a business.
 - Retail Stores, may open with a capacity limits of 10 percent or 100 people, whichever is lower, with other public health measures still in effect.
 - Food Court seatings are required to close, but restaurants may remain open for take out and delivery.
- The **Cross Lake Border** will lift restrictions to **ACCESS** and **LEAVE** the community, providing the following:
 - That you are able to produce a **COVID 19 Vacc Cert Card** that states that you have had both doses of the Moderna Vaccine signed off by Chief David Monias and NIC Doris Umpherville Thomas and/or a **Shared Health Print Out**. All People 18 and up from the same household in the Vehicle will have to produce their individual Vacc Cert Card and or a Shared Health print out.
 - If you do not have a Vacc Cert Card at present, you will still need an Authorization Form from Ryan or Darlene. Anyone coming from outside the community who does not have a Vacc Cert Card must get an Authorization Form and produce a Negative Covid Test and isolate upon return to the community.
 - Your temperature will still be checked at the Border
 - That you will sign in and out when accessing or leaving the community.
 - That you are in agreement to have your vehicle searched upon return into the community.

The following Community Restrictions will remain in effect till further notice:

- The Community Curfew will still be in effect from 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Border Crossing will remain closed from 12:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

All other restrictions must be followed and all provincial public health orders must be followed at all times.
