## RED CRITICAL LEVEL CROSS LAKE Sunday, November 15, 2020

**EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 12, 2020 AT 12:01 A.M. THE PROVINCIAL RESPONSE LEVEL WENT TO CRITICAL RED. THIS ORDER WILL BE IN EFFECT UNTIL 11:59 P.M. DECEMBER 11, 2020.**

**MEANING THAT COMMUNITY SPREAD OF COVID-19 IS NOT CONTAINED AND/OR THERE ARE SIGNIFICANT STRAINS ON OUR HEALTH CARE SYSTEM. THE NEW CRITICAL (RED) LEVEL RESTRICTIONS WILL BE IN EFFECT PROVINCE WIDE.**

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA HAD 494 POSITIVE CASES TODAY November 15, 2020. 30 CASES IN THE NORTHERN HEALTH REGION.

### EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SUMMARY FOR COVID-19, CROSS LAKE, MANITOBA

#### BY THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA

There are currently 68 confirmed cases in Cross Lake. 0 new cases have been reported since the last update on November 14, 2020.

76% of cases are considered recovered.

- As of 8:30 a.m. on November 15, PHIMS had 71 cases entered with a Cross Lake residence. Note that residence might be out of date on PHIMS, and the Master List from front-line nurses is currently the source of truth for this report.
- The Rapid Response Team (RRT) departed yesterday from Cross Lake.
- The cumulative incidence for Cross Lake is approximately 0.76% (761 per 100,000), similar to the cumulative incidence in Manitoba overall (0.80%, 797 per 100,000).
- The 20-29 age group has been most significantly impacted by this outbreak, comprising 31% of all cases.
- 3 tests were conducted yesterday, one was negative and the rest are pending. **All existing contacts have been tested**, so testing is now focused on walk-in presenting with symptoms.
