## **RED CRITICAL LEVEL CROSS LAKE THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2020**

**THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA HAS INITIATED NEW HEALTH ORDERS THAT WILL TAKE EFFECT AT 12:01 A.M. FRIDAY UNTIL DECEMBER 11, 2020.**

**THE RESTRICTIONS ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- **WILL RESTRICT PEOPLE FROM GOING INTO THE HOME, COTTAGE OR OTHER PRIVATE RESIDENCE OF ANOTHER PERSON (THIS IS IN THE CROSS LAKE HEALTH ORDER AS WELL AND HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED)**
- **EXCEPTIONS ARE HOME CARE, CHILD CARE, TUTORING, CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATIONS AND PEOPLE WHO LIVE ALONE, MAY HAVE ONE OTHER PERSON OVER**
- **PUBLIC GATHERING REMAINS AT 5**
- **THE SALE OF NON ESSENTIAL ITEMS IN STORES THAT ALSO SELL ESSENTIAL GOODS WILL ALSO BE BANNED. WILL BE REQUIRED TO TAKE OFF SHELVES OR ROPE AROUND THE NON ESSENTIALS.**
- **GROCERY STORES, PHARMACIES, REGULATED HEALTH PROFESSIONS AND OTHER ESSENTIAL SERVICE CAN CONTINUE TO OPERATE.**
- **A \$298.00 FINE FOR PEOPLE NOT WEARING A MASK FOR INDOOR PUBLIC PLACES.**

**THESE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDERS WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT TO DECEMBER 11, 2020**

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA HAD 475 **POSITIVE CASES** TODAY November 19, 2020. **55**  
**CASES** IN THE NORTHERN HEALTH REGION.

### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SUMMARY FOR COVID-19, CROSS LAKE, MANITOBA**

#### **96 % of all cases have recovered:**

There are currently **73** confirmed cases **from** Cross Lake. **70** confirmed cases **in** Cross Lake, **4** are deemed off reserve. **1** new case have been reported since the last update as of yesterday. This case was a known contact and was tested on November 13<sup>th</sup>. This individual is isolating outside the community.

**96%** of all cases are considered recovered. Of the 3 active cases, two are isolating in AIA in Winnipeg and 1 is isolating outside of the community. Only one case remains in hospital, but for non COVID-19 related reasons. So this case is now counted as “recovered” in regards to their COVID -19 infection.

There are 16 contacts actively being monitored.

Two tests were conducted yesterday-both are pending.

The passing in our community did not show up in our stats as the patient was deemed living off reserve.

**CASE STATUS:**

- **ACTIVE** 03 (all isolating outside the community)
- **RECOVERED** 67
- **CURRENTLY HOSPITALIZED** 01 (Non Covid Related Illness. Had Covid and recovered Different illness)

**MEDICAL:**

- **MEDICAL PATIENTS MUST HAVE A SAFE HOME TO RETURN TO, MEANING NO ONE SELF ISOLATING OR SELF MONITORING IN THE HOME. IF HOME IS NOT CLEARED, THEIR STAY WILL BE EXTENDED TILL THE HOME IS CLEARED BY PUBLIC HEALTH. FOR CLEARANCE, THE MEDICAL PATIENT WILL HAVE TO CALL LISA NACHBAUR OR NIC RANDALL AT NURSING STATION. 204-676-2011.**
- **MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS WHO ARE DRIVING OUT TO APPOINTMENTS CANNOT TAKE OTHER PEOPLE WITH THEM IN THEIR VEHICLE. JUST THE PATIENT AND ESCORT.**
- **MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS WHO ARE GOING IN THE MEDICAL VANS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BRING ANYTHING BACK BUT THEIR LUGGAGE.**

- **YOU ARE ISOLATING AND NEED SOMEONE TO GO SHOP FOR YOU, WE HAVE A LIST OF VOLUNTEERS**
- **IF YOU NEED TO GO SHOP ON YOUR SHOPPING DAY AND NEED A RIDE**
- **IF YOU NEED YOUR MEDICAL PACKAGES PICKED UP AND DELIVERED, PLEASE CALL 204-676-3133 FOR MICHELLE OR ANGELICA AND THEY WILL GLADLY ASSIST YOU.**
- **IF YOU ARE ISOLATING AT MIKISEW SCHOOL, AND NEED ASSISTANC, CALL RYAN CASTEL AT 204-676-0011.**

### **SOCIAL SERVICES:**

- THURSDAY AND FRIDAY WILL BE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE DISTRIBUTIONS FOR THE ONES THAT DID NOT HAVE A CHANCE TO PICK UP THEIR CHEQUES. THESE PEOPLE CAN DO THEIR SHOPPING ON THEIR DAY FROM THEIR RESPECTIVE AREA.

- CHILD TAX DAY BEING TOMORROW, FRIDAY, THE LEADERSHIP HAS APPROVED THE FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATION FROM THE CLPPC TO ACCOMMODATE PEOPLE THAT NEED TO SHOP FRIDAY AND SATURDAY. THIS IS IMPLEMENTED FOR THIS WEEK-END ONLY. AND WILL GO BACK TO REGULAR SHOPPING AREAS.

9:00 A.M. TO 2:00 P.M.      AREA 1 AND AREA 5  
2:00 P.M. TO 7:00 P.M.      AREA 2, AREA 3, AREA 4
- SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2020 SHOPPING SCHEDULE:  
9:00 A.M. TO 2:00 P.M.      AREA 1 AND AREA 5  
2:00 P.M. TO 7:00 P.M.      AREA 2, AREA 3, AREA 4
